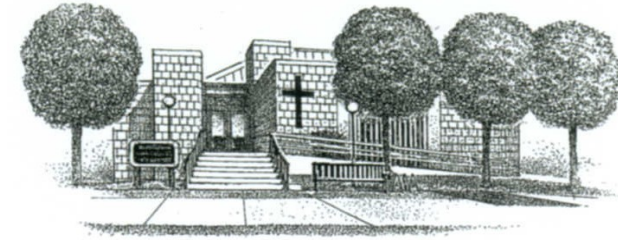

The First Reading **2 Kings 5.1-14** Don Henderson
A Syrian commander, following the directions of a faithful Israelite girl and the prophet Elisha, is cured of leprosy, thereby revealing God's mission to heal all who come to Him.

Psalm 30 pg. 739
Said antiphonally by verse, starting with congregation on the right (office) side of the nave.

Antiphonal recitation is usually verse-by-verse alteration between sections of the congregation. The term is from the Greek, meaning "voice against voice."

The Second Reading **Galatians 6.1-16** David Bevan
Living by the Spirit, says Paul, means following the law of Christ, embodied in his crucifixion: bearing one another's burdens, and working for the good of all.
