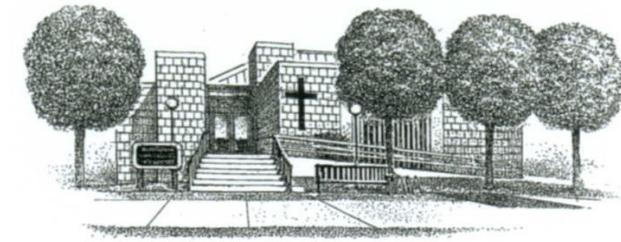

The First Reading **Amos 7.7-17** David Bowen
Amos refuses to be silenced when he is accused of treason for criticizing Israel's injustice and prophesying its destruction.

Psalms 82 pg. 815
Said antiphonally by verse, starting with congregation on the right (office) side of the nave.

Antiphonal recitation is usually verse-by-verse alteration between sections of the congregation. The term is from the Greek, meaning "voice against voice."

Paul gives thanks and prays for the Colossians' knowledge of God, which bears fruit of faith, hope, and love.
